Gian started his public service career at the District Department of the Environment serving as its first Chief of Compliance and Enforcement for Lead and Healthy Housing, and where he wrote the regulations that went into effect in the district for this environmental hazard. In 2012, he joined DC Water to establish their new Asset Management Program and, in 2019, he was tapped to launch DC Water's Lead Pipe Replacement Assistance Program (LPRAP). Gian recognizes the importance of "association work" for a variety of reasons, including career development, so he quickly joined CWEA when starting at DC Water. As a matter of course he previously served as President of an earlier industry trade group, the national Lead and Environmental Hazards Association (LEHA) in 2005/2006, so wanting to work with CWEA was natural.
