### A Rose by Any Other Name: Water Resources Recovery Facility

While WEF officially adopted and began using the term "water resources recovery facility" (WRRF) in place of wastewater treatment plant (WTP) in 2012 it has not yet become the new norm. However, focusing on the benefits of treatment rather that the waste coming into facilities not only better reflects the science/ magic takes places; research has shown that it changes the public's perceptions and value they place on what happens at a WRRF.

This year's WEFTEC Keynote speaker, Dr. Lera Boroditsky, gave a presentation entitled "Do you Talk Water?" She encouraged attendees to think more about the words they use and the power that language has in how others
